MARCH 5 1 to 4pm NÅLEBINDING

The basic technique involves the use of a single flat needle to make loops. The thread & needle is pulled through the loop, but the knot is not snugged up. This technique predates knitting & crochet. A firm or loose fabric for mittens, socks or scarves. Nålebinding works well with short pieces of yarn. Oldest known samples include the color-patterned sandal socks of the Coptic Christians of Egypt (4th century CE), & hats and shawls from cultures in Peru, dated between 300 BCE and 300 CE and popular in Scandinavian countries.

MARCH 26 9am to 4pm Cochineal Dyeing Class with Moxie Pender of Skyflight Alpacas

TIME: 9am to 4pm

Cochineal is an amazing dye made with tiny insects that live on prickly pear cactus. Cochineal is available in many forms - liquid extract, powdered, or whole bugs.

We will be dyeing with the whole bugs!

We will dye small samples of pre-mordanted yarn (mordanted with alum & cream of tartar) in varying percentages of cochineal (0.5% to 16%), with half of the samples going through a 4% Ferrous Sulphate afterbath. We will explore the effects on color by doing an acid shift (towards the reds), and an alkali shift to bring out the purples. We will also see what happens with no cream of tartar in the mordant. We will dye a variety of wools and other natural fiber yarns for a luscious display of color & texture.

FEE: \$80 includes hands-on dyeing of 42 beautiful samples ranging over pinks, orange, fuschia, berry, violet, scarlet & burgundy, instructions for mordanting & dyeing with cochineal, notebook with dye records, and a dyed 50 gm skein of your choice. Additional dyed or undyed skeins and dyeing materials available for purchase.
